




#### Dear Friend of Reading Amateur Regatta 1842,


You may have noticed something a little different about the Regatta this year. On the opposite side of the bank to the competitors, there is a Vintage Fayre in Caversham Court Gardens. The Caversham Traders Association are celebrating Reading's oldest sporting event by coming together for a summer fayre. (Thank you, Meena, for organising.) This reminds us of the first Regatta back in 1842 that was watched by the businessmen from Caversham Court Gardens, although back in those days the house was still present on the site. When you look across the river towards the finish line you can still see the Gazebo of Caversham Court. There used to be a boathouse beneath the Gazebo at the riverbank. We believe that this boathouse was the finish line for the original race which was won by Mr H Simonds Junior (Simonds being the name of the famous Reading brewers). The committee understands just how important sport is within our community and it is, therefore, delighted that Caversham and District Residents Association (CADRA) have donated local heritage maps to gift to our umpires and commentators. These maps clearly show how important the River Thames is within the Heritage of Caversham and Reading. Those reading the maps closely will have noticed that Caversham Bridge, where the competitors turn their boats to head back to Reading Rowing Club will be 100 years old in 2026. Thank you so much for attending Reading Amateur Regatta 2025, we are looking forward to seeing you again next year.
